McKenzie once again the King

Gerald McKenzie is back on top. One year after losing his title as King Trapper, McKenzie reclaimed his crown, winning a close race with Richard Danielson. McKenzie finished with 48 points, three ahead of Danielson, to take first place. Contestants are awarded five points for a first place finish in any event, with second receiving four points, third taking three points and so on down to a fifth place finish being worth one point. The lone exception is the flour packing, where first is worth seven points and goes down by one point for each runner up, with fifth

being worth three points. McKenzie had five first place finishes, taking top honors in trap setting, wood sawing, pulp cutting, log throw and the ice hole chop. McKenzie also recorded second places in axe throwing, fish frying and flour packing. Danielson, meanwhile, took firsts in the portage race, pole climbing, fried bannock and fish frying, as well as seconds in the pack race and fish filleting. Third place went to Richard Charles, who had 39 points. Last years King Trapper, John Hendrickson, finished sixth overall with 35 points.
